Rationale

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of the PE, sport and physical activity they provide.

Schools must use the PE and sport premium to:

- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now are sustainable and will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
- develop or add to the PE, sport and physical activity that the school provides

Key indicators

The PE and sport premium is used to secure improvements in the following 5 key indicators:

1. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
2. Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
3. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and physical activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Significant achievements to date

- Installation of Green Gym to encourage exercise and allow regulation for pupils
- Weekly Rebound Therapy programme, including staff training and support for identified pupils
- Increased range of sensory resources to support heavy muscle work and regulation activities
- Training of climbing wall instructors and increased participation in climbing and bouldering activities
- Specialist PE lead advice for Primary and Secondary non-specialist teachers
- Continued access to swimming for range of pupils outside Y5/6
- Full programme of outdoor adventurous activities
- Accessible sailing activities for variety of classes
- Maintenance of equipment on playground and Primary adventure playground
- Entry Level qualification in PE at KS4
- Sports Leaders link with Budmouth Academy inspiring pupils to engage in Sports Leaders qualification when they reach KS4
- Improved access to school field via ramp
- Purchase of all-terrain wheelchair for accessibility to offsite activities
- Painting of a sensory activity trail on the field pathway to encourage movement

How the Governing Body holds school leaders to account for the spending of PSP

The Headteacher reports annually on how PSP has been spent in the previous year and the impact that it has had on pupil progress and wellbeing. Next review Autumn 2025.

Impact on pupils of PSP

- Westfield fitness data demonstrates improving fitness levels for all pupils. Pupils will regularly have opportunities to swim and follow outdoor education programmes.
- Sensory and mobility needs of identified pupils will be met through Rebound Therapy. Staff are trained to deliver this intervention which runs for a half day per week.
- A wide range of pupils have access to swimming sessions during the year.
- All pupils benefit from a full programme of outdoor and adventurous activities, including WOEC and Weymouth and Portland Sailing Academy
- Installation of access ramp to school field has ensured accessibility for all students.
- Subject Lead participates in School Sport Forum meetings and networking and discussion will provide greater enhancement of opportunities for pupils.
- Maintenance of sports equipment ensures continued access for all pupils to a wide range of activities
- Pupils are motivated to engage in physical activity as they get older e.g. Sports Leaders, Jubilee Challenge, Duke of Edinburgh Award (Bronze and Silver).
